## Something Entirely Different



'Something different' is the ever present promise of Christmas. When the prophet Isaiah cried out in the wilderness he said to prepare the way of the Lord for "every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low" (Isaiah 40:4). When the prophet cried out to God he said the scripture which we read on the first Sunday of Advent, "O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence" (Isaiah 64:1). The most common imagery of Christmas, a light shining in the darkness, is also referenced by the prophet Isaiah, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness on them light has shined" (Isaiah 9:2). In not a single one of the prophecies or scriptures about the birth of Christ does it say or even make a nod towards the sentiment, "and all will be the same." At its very core, Christmas is about something entirely different disrupting our lives.

'Something different' may feel like a curse this year. COVID is not a blessing or a gift from God. It is not a tiny child wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manager. It is a natural force which has flattened our social interactions, laid low our plans, and brought darkness instead of light. Yet, it most certainly is 'something different' and even in the midst of the darkness of a pandemic, God still offers us light and the opportunity to experience an entirely disrupted social order.

The scriptures tell us again and again that the Kingdom of God does not look like our kingdoms or nations. God does not rule like the kings, queens, presidents, dictators, prime ministers, or chancellors of our world. The Kingdom of God doesn't even look like our social order with various hierarchies of power and wealth. The Kingdom of God is something entirely different. Often we have trouble imaging that our world could function in different ways – that we could reject power structures of oppression, that we could live as members of God's *loving* family, that everything we know could be turned upside down. But this year, we don't have to imagine it. Our lives have already been turned upside down. Social structures have shifted before our very eyes. I know that many want to "go back" to how things were before, but that isn't the call of Christmas. Christmas calls us forward into God's love. Christmas calls us into something entirely different.



In the early months of the COVID-19 pandemic, the United Church Board for Ministerial Assistance, which administers the Christmas Fund, experienced a 400% increase in requests for emergency grants over the previous year. Thanks to the generosity of more than 275 donors to urgent appeals for gifts to the Christmas Fund, UCBMA was able to say "yes" to each of these requests.

Most of the donors who responded to these special emergency appeals were older persons and nearly half were first time contributors to the Christmas Fund. Many are also themselves recipients of Ministerial Assistance.

Here are just a few of the notes of thanks received from some of the Emergency Grant recipients:

"I must tell you that before I opened the envelope with the check I prayed that whatever the contents, that somehow I would make the days to come work...and when I opened that envelope with a great amount of trepidation, I could not believe my eyes that you and your Committee granted me even more than I had requested! I am still in shock, and still feeling so very grateful as I sit down with that fear off my shoulders."

"Wow, what can I say but a very humble thank you. This is trememdously generous and I never, ever expected it. The best I had hoped for was to cover my recent medical bill. I am surprised and tearfully grateful."

"The emergency grant money arrived in last night's mail. THANK YOU to all who approved this emergency grant. I will be able to pay back loans that were made to make rent. We will also be able to supplement our rent money for quite some time until greater income starts coming in. We are jopeful those days will come."

"I'm speechless – Thank you all so very, very much! Keeping you all in my prayers. May the gift of your generous blessing spread wide and far."

#### In 2019, gifts to the Christmas Fund enabled:

- Monthly pension supplementation for 350 retired clergy and lay employees (\$1,347,419)
- Health Premium supplementation for 144 clergy and lay employees (\$374,577)
- Emergency grants for 69 individuals and families (\$123,727)
- Christmas "Thank You" gift checks to 521 retired clergy and lay employees (\$260,500)


